Hartland students took the State of Michigan required assessments in the spring. Below you will see that in 24 tested categories, HCS students increased proficiency in 21 of them (91%). Congratulations to our amazing staff and students for demonstrating improvement and for the effort put into helping all students succeed.

Much has been shared in the media recently about poor school attendance and the importance of regularly attending school. Last year, 15% of our students were chronically absent from school. The administration and staff will continue to reach out to parents when their child reaches 5, 10, 15 or more absences from school as our goal is to decrease chronic absenteeism. At times, the district will ask the county attendance officer for help in addressing the issues of individual students. The student achievement scores shared by Mr. Hughes this month are affected by student attendance which equates to the need to be in school daily. Thank you for your partnership in this endeavor.

I am an 8th Grade Science teacher at Hartland Middle School. I have a bachelor's degree from Western Michigan University in Biology and Science and a master's from Michigan State University in Educational Technology. This is my 22nd year at Hartland Schools—all in room 5 at the middle school.

I grew up in western Michigan but moved to Hartland to teach when I graduated. I haven't looked back. I have been married to a Hartland grad for 16 years. My wife is also a

teacher here in Hartland at Farms Intermediate. We live in the district and our kids attend elementary and middle school here as well. They are involved in various sports and are having a good time.

My favorite moments are always when students stay for a minute or two after each hour to tell me their own personal story about what we are studying in class, or something cool that is going on in their life. They often ask if they can bring in a cool insect they caught or a weird rock they found. Those short moments let you know as a teacher that you have made it past being just a body in the classroom every day.

Teaching science is my passion. Outside of school, you are likely to find me standing in the middle of a shallow pond or in a field with an insect net. I'm a scientist at heart and I try to bring that enthusiasm to my classes every day. The smiles and energy I get from the middle schoolers keeps me going.

Something I admire about the Hartland district is how committed we are to doing a great job for the kids. I'm always in awe at the level of talent and work ethic of the staff here at the middle school. I really believe every teacher is here for the right reasons and has the desire to get better every year. I have every reason to believe that across the district, others feel the same.
