I would like to welcome our new school safety team and express my gratitude to the Livingston County Sheriff Office and the Fortis Group as partners in this new initiative. It is my hope that students, staff and parents build strong relationships with these individuals as they help to create the safe environment, we all want our children to have.

Deputy Brian Chuff at HHS: Deputy Chuff has been with the department for 25 years. He has worked with many specialty teams within the department. He is joining our HCS Security Team at Hartland High School and is excited to be a positive role model for our students.

Detective Marc King at HMS: Deputy Marc King has worked for the Livingston County Sheriff Office for almost 24 years. Marc has spent the last 16 years of his career as a Detective, and previously worked as a road patrol deputy, field training officer and school resource officer. He was a member of the LCSO Tactical Team for fifteen years, where he was promoted to Team Leader. He has specialized training with the Michigan State Police Internet Crimes Against Children Task Force.

Marc holds a Bachelor's Degree from Adrian College in Criminal Justice. He is married, and lives in Howell with his two children. Hartland Consolidated Schools is school. excited to offer FREE breakfast and lunch to ALL students this school year thanks to the Michigan Healthy School Meals Program! All school breakfast and school

lunch meals will be FREE to ALL students for the 2023-24 school year. Parents/guardians do not need to fill out an application for these free meals. Meals will be FREE to ALL students regardless of application status.

These free meals include complete school meals only. Please remind your student that for a meal to be free, they must choose a fruit or vegetable every time. Each student may only have 1 free breakfast and 1 free lunch per school day. All students will continue to pay for ala carte items, second servings and ala carte milk. Students can only get 1 milk free when it is part of a complete meal.

Even though meals will be provided for free, it is important for families to continue to fill out free or reduced meal applications if they think they may qualify. An approved application may allow families to received additional assistance. This assistance may include reduced fees for athletics, clubs & community education, local food assistance, holiday meals and support, field trip support, school supplies, utilities support, reduced testing fees, college admission fee waivers and more. This also allows our schools to receive full access to federal and state funding for educational programs that our students are entitled to.

Welcome Back from Hartland Transportation!

The 2023/2024 school year has arrived, and we are looking forward to another great year! As always, we strive to make your child's bus ride a positive part of their educational experience. Here are a few important informational points for review:

- Your student must be waiting at the bus stop 5 minutes prior to the scheduled arrival
 of the bus. Once the alternating lights of the bus are deactivated, the bus driver cannot
 legally reactivate them and it is then the parent's responsibility to transport their student
 to school.
- Students and Parents should never try to catch the bus once the lights have been cancelled. Please do not go to another bus stop without contacting the Transportation Office; the bus driver must be notified.
- If possible, your house number should be visible from the traveled roadway; mailbox numbers are acceptable, but should be large enough and clearly visible on both sides.
- The expected behavior of the student rider is found in the Parent-Student Handbook.
 We encourage parents to review these responsibilities with their children to ensure their
 privilege of riding is not lost. The handbook can be found by going to the district website
 at www.hartlandschools.us, then clicking on Parents &
 Students, and then Handbooks
- Students should never cross the road prior to the arrival of the bus.

Welcome to Hartland Preschool!

The new school year is upon us and that means classrooms full of little ones (and their parents) experiencing school for the first time! Read on for some tips from preschool teachers on how to start the year off with positive and smooth transitions for a successful school year.

- 1. Quick goodbyes leave dry eyes. This is typically easier said than done but the longer the goodbye, the tougher it is for your little one to part ways. Give a quick hug and kiss, tell them you will see them soon and smile with a wave. They are in good hands!
- 2. Set a routine—and stick to it as much as possible. Routines are very helpful for setting structure and being able to anticipate what will happen next. Have a routine for getting ready each morning, as well as for going to bed at night. For example,each morning get dressed, have breakfast and start the day; each night, have dinner, get ready for bed, read a book, say goodnight.
- 3. Sleep! A good night's sleep is very important for a healthy and positive day!
- 4. Keep open communication. Be sure to keep your child's teacher in the loop about any changes that might have taken place at home, as well as any concerns or questions you might have. It will help you feel better about things and will let your child's teacher be able to make any necessary accommodations.






