MOST URGENT IS THE NEED FOR BUS DRIVERS

During the past year, the Livingston County Transportation Consortium has worked hard to create a salary and benefit package that would attract and retain bus drivers. If you or someone you know would like to drive for HCS, the following salary and benefits are available: **Hourly Wages:** Step 1-\$20.37 (up to \$22.62 for experience)

Signing Bonus: \$2,000

Longevity Bonus Annually: 5-7 years: \$500, 8-10 years: \$1,000; 11+ years: \$1,500

Sick Time Payout: Up to \$600 annually

Sick Time Retirement or Resignation bonus: Up to \$5,000 after 5 years of service

Medical Coverage: Single person coverage or \$5,000 cash in lieu for not taking insurance

Dental & Vision Coverage: Available to be purchased

Substitute Drivers: Commit to 75 days annually at the wage scale noted above and be paid up to \$20 per day in bonus money

We are flexible and would welcome part-time drivers which could be morning, afternoon, certain days of the week, etc.

All potential drivers will be paid for any time to train at regular driver wages.

The Board of Education continues to be committed to creating the safest educational environment possible for students and staff. Parents and school visitors will continue to be asked to produce a State of Michigan issued ID when entering the buildings. The district uses an identification system at all buildings, and without a state-issued ID you will not be permitted to enter. The volunteer and visitor procedures remain in place requiring pre-approval to volunteer and visit during the school day. We realize that this may be an inconvenience to you or your family, however, we feel that safely identifying and understanding who is in our school buildings is extremely important. We continue to provide school resource officers and school safety officers at all our buildings to support this effort.

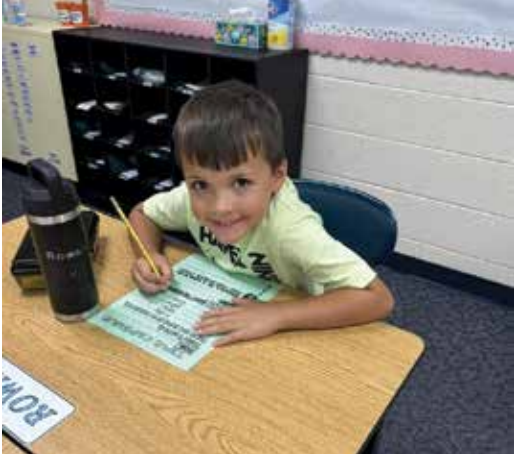

Welcome Back from Hartland Transportation!

The 2024/2025 school year is here, and we are anticipating it to be another great one! As always, we strive to make your child's bus ride a positive part of their educational experience. Here are a few important informational points for review:

- Your student must be waiting at the bus stop 5 minutes prior to the scheduled arrival of the bus. Once the alternating lights of the bus are deactivated, the bus driver cannot legally reactivate them and it is then the parent's responsibility to transport their student to school.
- Students and Parents should never try to catch the bus once the lights have been canceled. Please do not go to another bus stop without contacting the Transportation Office; the bus driver must be notified.
- If possible, your house number should be visible from the traveled roadway; mailbox numbers are acceptable, but should be large enough and clearly visible on both sides.
- The expected behavior of the student rider is found in the Parent-Student Handbook. We encourage parents to review these responsibilities with their children to ensure their privilege of riding is not lost. The handbook can be found by going to the district website at www.hartlandschools.us, then clicking on Parents & Students, and then Handbooks.
- Students should never cross the road prior to the arrival of the bus.

Millage Renewal and Restoration is on the Ballot this November

What is the Millage?

On behalf of all Livingston County School Districts and public school academies, the Livingston Educational Service Agency (LESA) is asking voters to consider renewing and restoring the special education millage approved in 2015.

Why is the Renewal & Restoration Important?

The renewal would impact all students by continuing funding for special education programs used by more than 3,500 students.

It also fills the funding gap left by insufficient federal and state funding that otherwise would be drawn from the general fund, reducing resources for all Livingston students.

Where do the Funds go?

100% of funds will go to local districts and public school academies for teachers, curriculum materials, and to cover the cost of paraeducators and providing essential services like unified sports, work readiness training, peer-to-peer programs, assistive technology, and behavioral support.

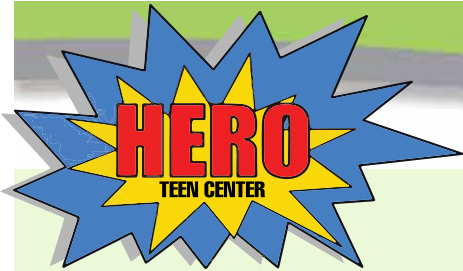

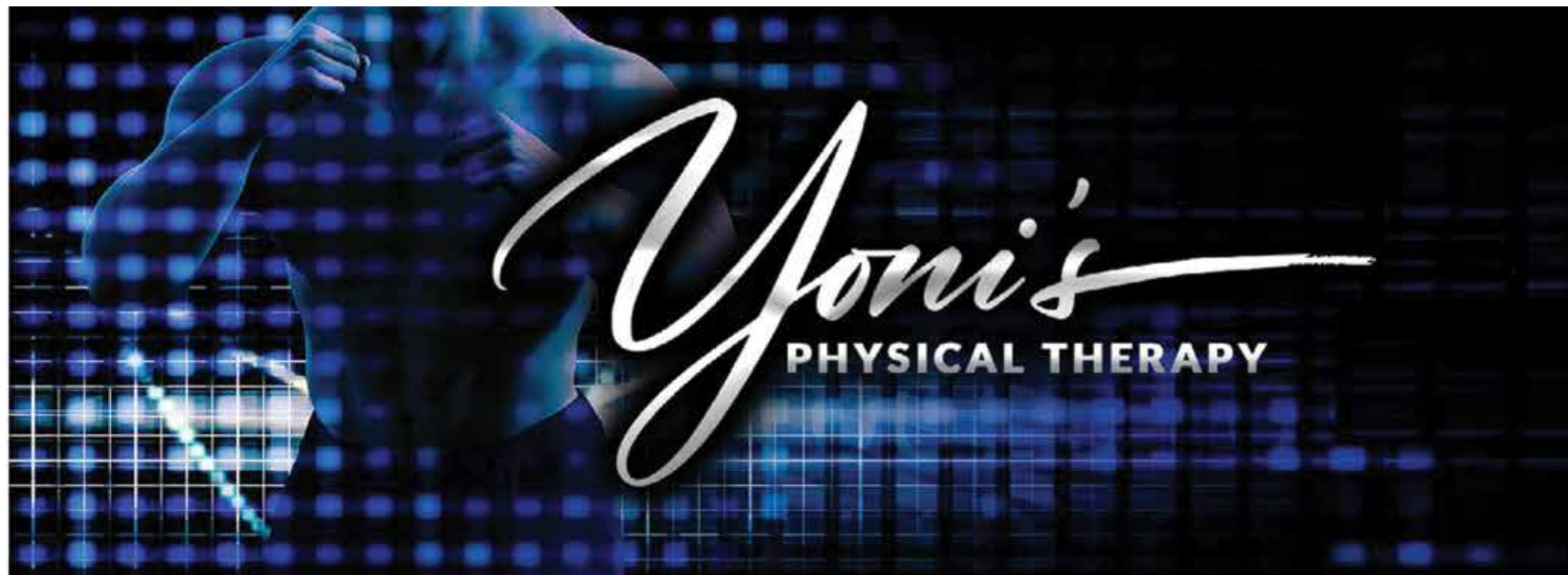

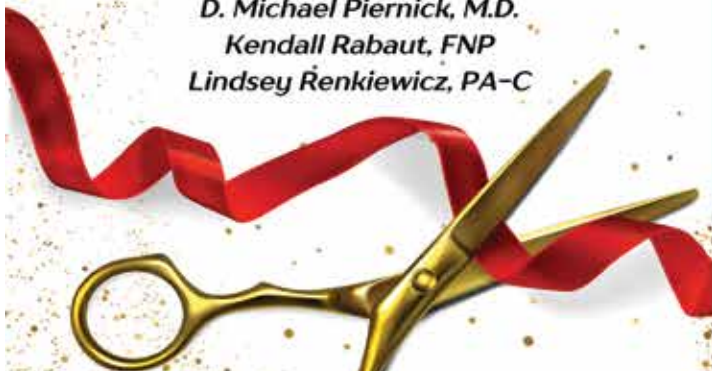
