Hartland High School

Did you know that Hartland High School will be administering the 9th grade Social Studies MEAP in an online format this year for the first time ever? HHS is one of only a few schools across the state that has been selected as a pilot. The testing will take place from October 16-November 1.

Hartland Middle School
