Hartland High School

Did you know that the Hartland High School Art department is doing hands-on projects that allow students to make art pieces using different mediums? Ms. Lynn Saint-Onge has returned to the High

School to teach jewelry lab! Currently, students in jewelry are learning how to make eye pins out of copper wire using pliers and hammers to eventually make long, wire chains using different chain-linking methods. Students will produce necklaces, bracelets, rings, or small portions of chain mail for one of their projects. Students in jewelry classes will also learn how to etch cuff bracelets, dog tags, as well as other metallic jewelry pieces before the end of the semester.

New to the art team this semester is Ms. Madelin Porter teaching ceramics!

Students in ceramics are very busy working on Greek coil pottery. Students use clay to roll a series of long coils, which are shaped on top of each other to create a piece of pottery. The coils are eventually smoothed out, will be glazed and baked in the kiln.

As part of our College and Career Readiness plan, all eighth-grade students complete an extensive assessment of aptitude, skills and interest using Zello, an engaging Career and College planning platform. They also learn about job preparation requirements and potential cost. All careers are linked to the Department of Labor's Occupational Outlook Handbook's ten-year projections. Lakes Elementary School

Did you know that kindergarten teachers at Lakes Elementary are co-teaching a new handwriting program to their students with the school occupational therapist, Jen Carnevale? The Size Matters Handwriting program is the first instructional handwriting program to shift the focus to Letter Size. When students correct errors in Letter Size, they make an immediate and measurable difference in the consistency, and therefore readability of their work. Research studies show that teaching handwriting to young students significantly contributes to higher literacy rates and substantially improves the quality and length of their written composition work.

Before teaching the program, a pre-test was conducted in one kindergarten class to determine where each individual student's baseline fell for written letter legibility of their lowercase alphabet. Seven weeks later, a similar post-test was given to compare the results of explicitly teaching handwriting. Legibility was noted to have significantly increased and we are hopeful that we will continue to see this same growth in the remaining three kindergarten classes currently being taught!

Round Elementary School

Did you know we got painted? The Round office, gym, hallways, and bathrooms have been painted. Soon, our classrooms will be getting a fresh coat of paint. The new paint has really brightened up the hallways and given Round a "Looks like brand new" feel.
