Ages 5-11 Vaccinations:

Vaccinations are now available for children ages 5-11 years old. Currently, about 14% of the counties children in this age range have received at least the first dose of the vaccination. I share this information as the district continues to operate through the lens of offering choice to parents. It is anticipated that as soon as our return from the Holiday Break, we will no longer quarantine healthy JK-6 students. This model has worked well for our 7-12 students with no discernable change in the school transmission numbers when we were quarantining at six feet and three feet exposure limits. While it is anticipated that this will occur, it is not finalized. What I can do is encourage those wishing to be vaccinated to follow through as soon as possible.
