Great Start and Head Start Availability



Since my last update on April 20, 2022, the data shows:

Livingston County Average Percentage of Positive Results for all Tested: 9.5%

Head Start and GSRP Frequently Asked Questions

What are the age requirements for the program?

- 3 year olds who are 3 on, or before, Dec 1st are eligible to attend Head Start
- 4 year olds are eligible for both Head Start and the Great Start Readiness Program (GSRP)

What is the difference between Head Start and GSRP?

- Head Start is a federally funded program for 3 and 4 year olds
- GSRP is a state funded program for 4 year olds

Both are school readiness programs that prepare children with the necessary skills for a successful transition to kindergarten. Both of our programs use a state approved curriculum and assessment tool.

Is there a cost for children to attend Head Start or GSRP?

Head Start is no cost to families. GSRP is no cost to families who are income eligible. GSRP children who are over income may be charged tuition based upon a sliding fee scale. The current fee schedule for those between 250-300% of FPL is \$20.00 per month and those above 300% of FPL is \$40.00 per month.

Do all children qualify for the program?

Eligibility is based on several factors including age, income, and need. These determine placement priorities. Our programs are not first-come first-served and we do maintain a waiting list.

Do children need to be potty-trained?

No, children do not need to be potty trained to apply for, or be enrolled in, Head Start or GSRP.

What is the adult to child ratio?

Head Start and GSRP have a minimum of one adult to eight children. All of our classrooms exceed this minimum and are staffed with 3 adults for 16 children.

Can children with a disability or IEP participate in a Head Start or GSRP program?

We are committed to the inclusion of children with special needs in an integrated setting with their typically developing peers.

Does the program follow the school year calendar?

We make every attempt to follow the local district calendars. Our programs operate Monday through Thursday from 8:45-3:45. Unfortunately at this time, we do not offer before or after care.

Is transportation available?

Transportation may be available but not always guaranteed. We utilize pre-established group bus stops in an effort to transport as many children as possible. We are limited to 20 children on a bus with a driver and 1 assistant.
