HHS = August 4th from 8:00 to 11:00 a.m. and 12:00 to 3:00 p.m. Registration 10th - 12th

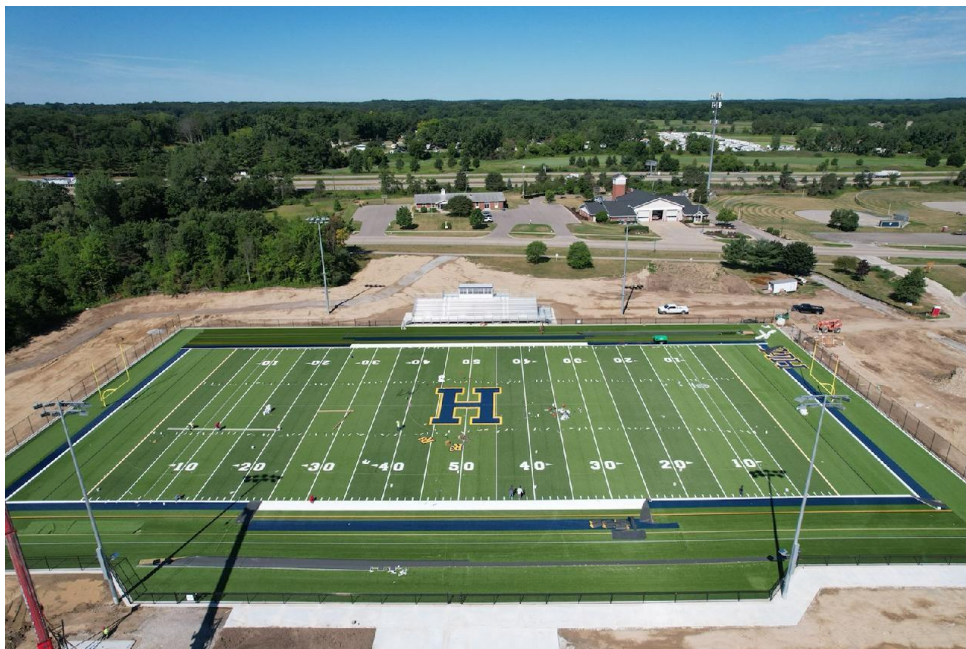
HHS = August 8th from 8:00 a.m. to 12:00 p.m. Freshman Registration

What is the difference between curriculum and resources? I often find that individuals struggle with identifying the difference between curriculum and additional resources used to support the teaching of the State of Michigan Standards (<https://www.michigan.gov/mde/services/academic-standards>). The key in understanding this difference is in understanding that curriculum is the written expectations and required resources that the district provides teachers to ensure that the State Standards are being taught. Additional resources may be needed to best teach these standards. One required resource provided by the district for all Michigan content courses is a pacing guide that is developed to help keep teachers on pace to teaching all required standards. As teachers develop lessons to meet the established expectations, they use their experience to gather additional resources that are available to help in best introducing and teaching the standards for student learning. An example of an additional resource might be what is learned through professional development. For instance, Hartland Schools will welcome Mr. Horacio Sanchez to meet with our teaching staff this school year. Mr. Sanchez is one of the nation's prominent experts on promoting student resiliency, and applying brain research and neuroscience, to improve school outcomes and achievement, as well as closing the achievement gap. Mr. Sanchez applies brain-based science and best practice research in helping schools improve school climate.
