Unfortunately, I Have to Address Misinformation Being Shared Once Again: Today, I was made aware of a social media post in which the author misinforms the audience that Hartland Schools has created gender neutral restrooms. The post goes on to question the district's receipt of over \$2,000,000 through the Federal Child Nutrition program in 2021-22 when they should have only qualified for \$700,000. Asking the question, what has the district done with the profit?

Fact: The district has not established gender neutral bathrooms. We continue to have male and female restrooms in all our buildings.

Fact: What the post did not state is that in 2021-22 the federal government funded free meals for all students and not just those qualifying for free or reduced priced meals. The dollars received were used to feed ALL children for free.

Fact: Any institution or organization, whether they accept federal dollars or not, has no choice but to agree to follow all non-discrimination laws or policies. It is illegal to discriminate.

Fact: Courts have upheld that tax-exempt organizations must follow non-discrimination laws or policies such as Title IX.

Fact: I confirmed that the neighboring school district identified in the social media post is following the same process as HCS and receiving federal funding.

Conclusion: If we take all references to money off the table, the fact is that all school districts, including Hartland Consolidated, cannot discriminate against any student or staff member. Title IX and other non-discrimination laws and policies must be followed.
