Meet Meghan Glabach, Board of Education Trustee





Election Sign Public Service Announcement: I have been getting questioned regarding placement of election signage. My office has reached out to the County Clerk's Office and Hartland Township to inquire about easement and obstruction of view placements. If you are concerned that signage has been placed on your property (any easement is a property owner's right to control), or concerned that signage blocks your view to oncoming traffic, you can reach out to the township in which you live to notify them of this concern. Signage is a township ordinance issue not a district issue. Again, please contact your township with concerns as the school district does not have jurisdiction over signage placement.

After School Support for Math and English at Hartland High School: Beginning next week, the high school staff is going to be offering Math and English support after school on a regular basis on Mondays, Wednesdays and Thursdays. Teachers will be available for one hour after school. Students can attend for the entire hour or just a portion of it. However, they do need to be in the room by 2:30pm if they plan on attending.

Math will be open to anyone on all three of the days. English 9 support will be on Monday. English 10 and 12 will be on Wednesday. English 11 support will be on Thursday. Students do not need to make an appointment to attend as this is open to all who need/want help. Our teachers and classrooms will rotate, so staff will post a schedule on the office window of the room location for the day. Students can talk with their current math/ELA teacher for the specific location. This time should be used to help with the current curriculum and content they are working on as well as old stuff from previous years that they want help with. If your student is interested in attending on Monday, math support will be in room 309 and ELA 9 will be in room 307.

Note: Our other buildings will be reaching out to parents regarding after school academic support opportunities. These programs are being made available using one-time dollars designed to help children overcome learning loss due to the challenges of education during the past few years.
