Misinformation

Last week, I was made aware of some social media comments regarding the district's increase of administrative positions since 2017-18. Unfortunately, the information was far from accurate as the district has maintained the same number of administrative positions with the exception of this school year, when we added the Director of Student Services position to help with management of our new security team and school safety (Mr. Mike Capra handled these duties before he resigned from his position), staff and student education around bullying, harassment, and discrimination, and to be a liaison with the Department of Justice to demonstrate our commitment and effort toward addressing any and all concerns regarding incidents of discrimination. This position was developed, discussed with the Board of Education, and adopted in June of 2023. As the Superintendent, I cannot ignore the harm of misinformation used to create inaccurate narratives when district personnel work so hard to ensure that we remain a premier school of choice district, and take fiscal responsibility seriously. The latest data available shows that the district spends about 2.7% of its total budget on administrative/business costs which is in the bottom 3% of all districts in the State of Michigan. This statistic shows how frugal the district is with spending taxpayer dollars. Thank you to all our administrators, teachers, and support staff for the great work you are doing. As I shared earlier in a Weekly Update, every school in the district has received the best Michigan Department of Education rating possible and our parents have indicated positive perceptions regarding the safe environments in HCS schools. Congratulations!
