District Using Charter Buses For After School Activities

Why are charter buses being used for after school activities? As most of you know, the district continues to be short of bus drivers to efficiently deliver students to school and back home each day. I recently made the decision to utilize charter buses to run after school activities. We will always try to use our own staff and buses whenever possible; however, sometimes we are unable to do so.


What is the difference in cost between the district transporting students and the use of charter buses?

The district estimates between \$1,000 to \$1,250 per bus more than using our buses.

What would help to save the cost of using charter buses on these trips? What would help is more drivers signing up to run daily routes, substitute or part time such as mornings, afternoons or a few days a week. We are flexible in this endeavor, and welcome a conversation with anyone who may have available time and would like to drive for us. Just reach out to 810-626-2175 and inquire.

The hope is that over time we can gain a full staff of daily drivers and an abundance of substitute drivers waiting to pitch in so that after school trips and field trips can be facilitated with district staff and buses.
